FROM THE HISTORIAN - Red Skelton - THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

On January 14, 1969 during the Red Skelton Hour this was included on his show.

"Getting back to school, I remember a teacher that I had. Now I only went, I went through the seventh grade. I left home when I was 10 years old because I was hungry. (Laughter) And...this is true. I worked in the summer and went to school in the winter. But, I had this one teacher; he was the principal of the Harrison School in Vincennes, Indiana. To me, this was the greatest teacher, a real sage of..of my time, anyhow. He had such wisdom. We were reciting the Pledge of Allegiance one day, and he walked over. This little old teacher...Mr. Laswell was his name. He said: "I've been listening to you boys and girls recite the Pledge of Allegiance all semester and it seems as though it is becoming monotonous to you. If I may, may I recite it and try to explain to you the meaning of each word?

I me, an individual, a committee of one.

Pledge dedicate all of my worldly goods to give without self-pity.

Allegiance my love and my devotion.

To the Flag of the our standard, Old Glory, a symbol of freedom. Wherever she waves, there's respect because your

loyalty has given her a dignity that shouts freedom is everybody's job.

United that means that we have all come together.

States of America individual communities that have united into 48 great states.

48 individual communities with pride and dignity and purpose, all divided

with imaginary boundaries, yet united to a common purpose, and that's love for country. Republic – a state in which sovereign power is invested in representatives chosen by the

and to the Republic Republic – a state in which sovereign power is invested in representatives chosen by the people to govern. And government is the people and it's from the people to the leaders, not

from the leaders to the people.
